It seems to me that the situation has been unnecessarily aggravated by North American interference.

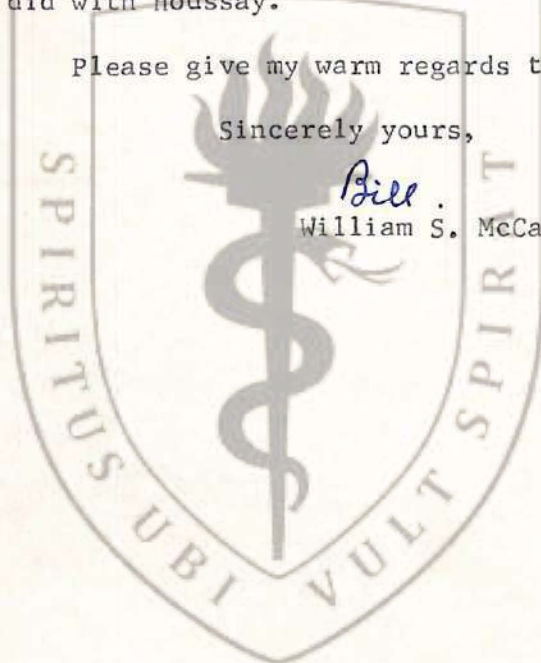
